# **Excitement Builds as Gateway Project Moves Forward**

The Gateway Project is a series of long lasting capital improvements that will make the Nature Discovery Center more visible and more accessible, increasing the number of people we impact, and creating a more welcome entrance into nature.

If you haven't visited the center recently to see the phase one improvements to the interior of the Henshaw House (completed in 2014), we hope you will make it a point to do so!

Plans for the second phase of Gateway continue to progress as excitement builds for what is to come during 2015. The front lawn and the one-acre area around the Henshaw House will have a new look with the addition of a new walkway and native plants. The Pavilion area will be improved with new smooth surfaces and planters for the sensory garden along with a new outdoor restroom and handwashing stations. The outdoor animals are looking forward to new habitat enclosures and an adjoining program space. No modifications are planned within the heart of Russ Pitman Park.

The Center engaged SWA as landscape architects in 2014 to design and oversee the construction of the outside Gateway Project improvements. \$500,000 in City of Bellaire bonds issued in August 2014 and privately raised funds will be used to cover the cost of the capital improvements. There is still time to contribute financially to our capital improvement efforts. Schematic designs are nearing completion and next comes construction documents, bidding, permitting, and contractor selection. Right now expect for construction to begin around May 1st and last around six months. The Center staff is busy planning great spring and summer programming that will be conducted inside the house or in other areas of the park. Our Summer Camps will be filled with fun and exciting times and the Discovery Rooms inside the Henshaw House will remain open on their regular schedule.



# **Spring Migration Field Trip for Senior Members**

Our annual Spring Migration Field trip for senior members to **Anahuac National Wildlife Refuge** and **High Island** during the height of spring migration is set to go! We are lucky to have the Harris Co., Precinct 3 free bus for seniors for the trip! It is a great time to look for many species of warblers, vireos, buntings, orioles and other migrants.

This trip is offered to NDC Members only. If you are not already a member, you can join online when you sign up for the trip.

**Cost:** \$7/person for Audubon Sanctuary Day Pass OR free with Audubon Sanctuaries Season Pass (\$25). You must pay this fee or bring/buy your Season's Pass the day of the trip. Donations to the Nature Discovery Center for staff time to organize and lead this trip are also appreciated.

**Meeting / Parking Place:** The bus will depart at 7:30 am from Evergreen Pool parking lot, on Evergreen Street at Newcastle in Bellaire, across from Russ Pitman Park and return by 7:30 pm.

When registering, please enter the name and number of your emergency contact person who will not be on the trip with us. This is a Harris Co. requirement!

Our thanks to Steve Radack and Harris County, Precinct 3, for providing this bus service for seniors. The bus makes a great observation platform while birding Shoveler Pond and the roadside canals of Anahuac NWR. Although there is no bathroom on the county bus, we will make bathroom stops along the way.

The Nature Discovery Center will provide bottled water. Bring your own drinks, snacks, lunch, insect repellent, binoculars and field guides. (If you need to borrow a pair of binoculars please let us know when you register.) Rain will bring down more birds for us to look at, so this trip will go regardless of the weather. Dress and be prepared accordingly.
