

Beginning Birding Program for Kids

Do you have kids who are interested in birds? Do they like to get outside to learn more about nature?

This winter we are offering a new Beginning Birding program for kids, led by Senior Staff Naturalist and long time birder, Mary Ann Beauchemin. This series of 5 classes will be offered every other Saturday. Kids will learn how to use binoculars and bird books, and get some tips to help them identify different kinds of birds. We will also play some fun games to help kids practice learning how to identify local birds. Most classes will meet at the Nature Discovery Center, but a few of the classes will meet at other nearby sites, like Willow Water Hole, to look for birds like herons, egrets, and ducks. One adult is welcome to accompany each child at each of the class sessions at no charge.

Note: If there is interest to continue into the spring, we can schedule a second session of classes to do that!

The Nature Discovery Center is excited to take part in the Great Backyard Bird Count (GBBC) again!

Bird watchers from around the world will take part in this annual event sometime between Friday, February 12, and Monday, February 15, 2016. Participants in the free event will join tens of thousands of volunteers of all levels of birding experience to count birds in their own backyards, local parks or wildlife refuges.

Ve will meet at the front porch

Join us on **Saturday, Feb. 13, 2016 from 9:00 to 10:30 am** for the count. We will meet at the front porch of the Nature Discovery Center. If you are a little late, just find us in the park. Families are welcome. Registration is not required.

Bring a pair of binoculars, but if you don't have any, we have a couple of extra pair here. Please call or e-mail Mary Ann ahead of time to make sure we have a pair for your use if needed. (mbeauch@naturediscoverycenter.org)

Checklists submitted by all "citizen scientists" help scientists and researchers learn more about how different bird species are doing, how their populations and ranges are changing, and how to protect them. Last year's record breaking GBBC turned in more than 147,265 checklists from people in over 100 countries. Even more amazing is that bird watchers reported 5,090 species with a total of 18,726,079 individual birds counted! Worldwide, Ecuador recorded the greatest number of species in 2015 with 784. A record 671 species were recorded in the United States.

Our 2015 Pumpkin Patch was Amazing! Many Thanks for Your Support



Welcome Volunteers Wanted

The primary responsibility of our Welcome Volunteers is to welcome visitors to the nature center and assist them with their needs. They also inform visitors of ongoing events or programs, direct them to areas of interest, and answer questions about the center. During down-time, Welcome Volunteers often assist us with special projects, including things like prep for Story Time, or light database work. Our ideal reception volunteer is at least 16 years old, and is a people person.
