Park Transformation!

If you have visited recently you have seen that the final phase of our major capital renovation, the Gateway Project, is complete! We are thrilled with the addition of an outdoor restroom, a revamped pavilion area, and other transformative changes.

But we're not done! More park improvements are under way.

In 2010, we established a Grounds Task Force to develop a master plan for Russ Pitman Park. Steady progress has been made with native planting and trail development, in large part with help from Eagle Scout projects! This spring we will complete several game-changing nature park improvement projects. A key partner in these projects is Resource Environmental Solutions (RES) — the largest habitat restoration company in the country. RES has agreed to donate their services to enhance the 4 habitat zones in the park through pond restoration, nonnative plant removal, and native plantings throughout the park.

Additionally, as many of you know, our current center path floods each time it rains...and we're in Houston! We are replacing this path with a Porous Pave nature trail made from recycled rubber, saving 750 tires from the landfill. The new center trail will be porous, allowing water to flow through and allowing visitors to enjoy the park after a rain. This pathway will have a gentle curve through the middle of the park, creating a more natural experience and highlighting our mature pecan trees, Pocket Prairie, and other native plants.

A raised wooden boardwalk with a bench will be built through the prairie wetland area. This boardwalk will complete our ADA accessible trail

loop and provide a dry seating area for birdwatchers and photographers. We are also installing a wooden teaching deck in our Cypress Pond, allowing our naturalists to teach classes focused on pond life.

Finally, professionally designed, custom interpretive signage will be installed throughout the park to ensure all visitors to Russ Pitman Park have an opportunity to learn about its unique habitats.

We are so grateful for all the donors that have made these improvements possible. Once complete, we will have you over to experience it! *Mark your calendars for our reveal event on Saturday, May 6th at 10am, and see page 2 for more event details.*





Spring Migration Field Trip for Senior Members

Our annual Spring Migration Field trip for senior members to **Anahuac National Wildlife Refuge** and **High Island** during the height of spring migration is set to go! We are lucky to have the Harris Co., Precinct 3 free bus for seniors again this year for the trip! It is a great time to look for many species of warblers, vireos, buntings, orioles and other migrants.

Online at www.naturediscoverycenter.org/birding. If you have any problems call 713-667-6550. If the trip is full when you try to sign up, please put your name on the wait list as there are people who have to cancel every year.

Cost: \$8/person for Audubon Sanctuary Day Pass OR free with Audubon Sanctuaries Season Pass (\$30). You must pay this fee or bring/buy your Season's Pass the day of the trip. Donations to the Nature Discovery Center for staff time to organize and lead this trip are also appreciated.

Meeting / Parking Place: The bus will depart at 7:30 am from the Evergreen Pool parking lot, on Evergreen Street near Newcastle in Bellaire, across from Russ Pitman Park and return by 7:30 pm.

When registering, please enter the name and number of your emergency contact person who will not be on the trip with us. This is a Harris Co. requirement!

Our thanks to Steve Radack and Harris County, Precinct 3, for providing this bus service for seniors. The bus makes a great observation platform while birding Shoveler Pond and the roadside canals of Anahuac NWR. Although there is no bathroom on the county bus, we will make bathroom stops along the way.

The Nature Discovery Center will provide bottled water. Bring your own drinks, snacks, lunch, insect repellent, binoculars and field guides. (If you need to borrow a pair of binoculars please let us know when you register.) Rain will bring down more birds for us to look at, so this trip will go regardless of the weather. Dress and be prepared accordingly.

Willow Waterhole Bird Surveys

The **Nature Discovery Center** and **Houston Audubon** are partnering to conduct the monthly Willow Waterhole bird survey. Mary Ann Beauchemin, Senior Naturalist at the NDC leads these surveys on the 3rd Saturday of each month *except December*.

We would love to have you volunteer to help out with this survey! Beginning birders can help spot birds and experienced birders can help identify them. We break into groups to try and cover a good portion of the park. Trails are fairly easy walking and the survey takes about 2 hours.

March 18 at 8 am and April 15, May 20, & June 17 at 7 am

Meet: in the parking lot of the Gathering Place at 5310 South Willow Drive, Houston.

The Willow Waterhole Conservation Reserve is a 290-acre park on the site of a Harris County Flood Control District retention pond project. It is an excellent birding area within the City of Houston, just outside the southwest corner of Loop 610. Over 200 species have been reported to eBird since this survey began.
