Jun 8 - 12 & Jun 15 - 19 Wild Encounters

Join us for a fun exploration of the animals in our park and around Texas. We'll learn the animal groups and learn how to study them (as well as some basic animal science) by encountering live animals in the classroom and out in the field. Become a junior zoologist at the Nature Discovery Center!



Jun 22 - 26 & Jun 29 - Jul 3 Can You Dig It?

Create your own garden at Nature Discovery Center. Nurture plants while learning about what makes them special, play in the mud, even craft your own gardening tools!




Jun 29 - Jul 3 Wilderness Adventure 101 (ages 8 to 12)

From climbing Everest to paddling the Amazon, we'll spend the week imagining and preparing for all the grand outdoor adventures we will go on! We'll test our survival skills, build our own shelters and campfires, learn to navigate out on the trails, make tasty snacks from plants (and bugs!), and prepare our packs with all the needed tools for adventure! And, there will of course be S'mores!



Jul 6 - 10 & Jul 13 - 17 Art in Nature

Explore the beauty in nature all around us. We'll spend the week adding to our nature scrapbooks, painting watercolors, designing crafts and sculptures using natural materials, and we'll even create our own whimsical masterpieces in the park!



Learn strategies animals and plants use to hunt and locate each other in the wild. Put those strategies into practice in a multitude of games. Create camouflage crafts and build hiding spots in the woods.



Set your city kids loose in this action packed week of adventure in the woods! We'll climb trees, build tee-pees, and learn to live like our woodland animal neighbors! In this jungle construction camp, we'll build like a beaver and nest like a newt! We'll create kid-size forts out in the forest. We'll spin giant spider webs along the trail and design terrariums to take home! Join us for the habitat-building fun!





Aug 10 - 14 & Aug 17 - 21 Water Wonders: Wet & Wild

Put water to the test in a series of aquatic games and activities to discover the properties of water, observe aquatic habitats and the living things that call water home. Learn firsthand what it takes to be an aquatic biologist. Get ready to get wet and make a splash!


