# **Spring Migration Field Trip: Birding Along the Upper Texas Coast**

Sunday, April 16

Join birding expert and board member Cin-Ty Lee and retired NDC Head Naturalist Mary Ann Beauchemin on a day trip along the upper Texas coast during the 2023 spring migration.

We will start from the Bolivar Peninsula in search of shorebirds and waders, which will be staging in large numbers as they prepare to head north. After Bolivar, we will head to High Island, where we will look for colorful Neotropical songbirds as they come in off the Gulf of Mexico. If there is time, we will end the day at Anahuac National Wildlife Refuge in search of more waders and some breeding songbirds.

This trip is good for beginners and advanced birders as there will be something for everyone.

# 2023 Dates & Camp Descriptions:

### Jun 5 - 9 & Jun 12 - 16 Into the Trees

Come explore the forests of the world with us as we have a look at trees, forests, and the animals that live in them. We'll learn to identify and care for native Texas trees. We'll encounter forest and tree dwelling animals out in the park, and live animals in the classroom. We'll also learn about different forest types around the world.

# Jun 19 - 23 & Jun 26 - Jun 30 Tracks and Scat

Become an animal tracker and learn how to identify animals by the signs they leave behind in nature. You'll investigate tracks and make some of your own in this camp full of tips and techniques naturalists use to study animals in the wild. We'll also take a peek at animal poop. Everybody poops, and poop can be a great storyteller of where animals live, where and when they move in their habitat, what they have been eating, and more!



# Jul 10 - Jul 14 & Jul 17 - Jul 21 Creepy Crawlies

Join us as we get to know the world's spineless wonders. In outdoor rambles and classroom investigations, we'll encounter a wide variety of invertebrate animals. Worms, insects, spiders, centipedes, and octopuses... oh my!



Kids, you need a time and place where you can connect with nature and have fun making big messes, and this camp is it! Feel mud between your toes, dig in the dirt with your hands, play with sticks, and more during fun days of messy play at camp. You'll hose down and wash up before pick-up so the mess stays with us! A win-win for you and for your parents!



# Aug 7 - 11 & Aug 14 - 18 World of Water

Water covers most of the surface of the Earth, and there are multitudes of animals that live in water. Join us on an aquatic adventure, as we discover the lives of animals that live in oceans, lakes, rivers and ponds from around the world.
