Bird Club

for Tweens & Adults

Tweens (10 - 14) Mondays at 4:30 pm - March 4 to May 20

Adults (18+) Wednesdays at 5 pm - March 6 to May 22

Do you want to start a new hobby? Here is your chance! Join our bird club and learn the basics of birdwatching. Over 10 weeks you will learn different characteristics and techniques to identify birds successfully. Classes will include a 30-35 minute lecture (printed lecture notes provided) and a 25-30 minute hike in the park to see birds.

Cost: \$175 (This includes binoculars!)

Participants will bring their given binoculars to class.


Other School's Out Day Camps

Walk on the Wild Side (starts on front porch)

Jun 3 - 7 & Jun 10 - 14 Furry & Fuzzy Friends

Join us for an exploration of mammals, furry and fuzzy friends, from Texas and around the world. We'll seek them in the wild, and meet with live friends in the classroom.

Jun 17 - 21 & Jun 24 - Jun 28 Homes & Habitats

Head out into the wild and explore a number of different animal homes and habitats. We will learn this topic through field science, art, and live animal care.
