Ambassador Alligator News

In late October, Head Naturalist Eric Duran traveled down to Brazos Bend State Park to release our Ambassador Alligator Krosis back into the wild. Krosis came to us from Brazos Bend in fall 2023 after hatching from a clutch of eggs laid too close to a trail to remain in the wild safely. Krosis outgrew the Angelo McNulty-Portnoy Alligator Enclosure after just a year in our care, and was healthy, robust, and ready to be released back in nature.

While at Brazos Bend, Eric picked up a cute new 3 month old baby alligator who is already settling in to our alligator enclosure. Our new alligator came from a nest that was flooded out during a fall storm. Some eggs from this nest were successfully rescued by Brazos Bend staff and we are lucky enough to get the honor of raising one of the rescued babies up for eventual release. Note: You must be a Family Level or higher NDC Member to hold a party at the Center.

Birthday parties at the Center include reserved use of our outdoor Pavilion Area for a 2 hour party with your guests, as well as one party program option of your choice (see below). Our party programs each last about 45 minutes depending on the age and interest level of party guests.

Your total pavilion reservation time includes 30 minutes before and after your party to allow time for set-up and clean-up. For example, if your party is from 10 am - 12 pm you can arrive to set up at 9:30 am and you can stay to clean up until 12:30 pm.
